

By air

Cardiff Airport has direct flights from over 28 destinations, connections to 150+ destinations worldwide and routes to major hub airports. www.cardiff-airport.com

Cardiff Airport is located 12 miles west of Cardiff City centre and 10 miles from J33 on the M4. Private transfers can be arranged to and from Cardiff Airport with FlightLink Wales.

By road

Cardiff is on the A48/M4, providing a direct route from London. The M50 and M5 link with the M4 from the Midlands and North of England and the South West of England.

The M4 motorway provides fast links between Cardiff and the rest of the UK.



By rail

Cardiff has direct rail links to many cities in the UK including London, Birmingham, Southampton, Manchester, Liverpool, Nottingham, Bristol and Exeter.

Cardiff is the closest capital to London; with the electrification of the South Wales mainline London Paddington to Cardiff is under two hours and trains depart every 30 minutes. Cardiff Central Station is conveniently located in the heart of the city centre just a short walk from most hotels, attractions, retail and conference venues. Cardiff was one of the first UK destinations to offer special GWR rail fares for conference delegates.






Cardiff, Wales' capital city, offers a huge range of exciting attractions, vibrant entertainment and quality shopping, all within walking distance.


Innovative architecture sits alongside historic buildings and Cardiff Bay offers a stunning waterfront location for an event.

unforgettable evenings of Welsh hospitality.





























Over 20 million visitors come to Cardiff annually, attracted to the city's heritage, culture, entertainment and world class events.

UEFA Champions League Final

The Women's UEFA Champions League Final took place Thursday 1 June 2017 at the Cardiff City Stadium. The Men's UEFA Champions League Final took place Saturday 3 June 2017 at the National Stadium of Wales.

Cardiff the smallest city, Wales the smallest country and FAW the smallest Host Association to have hosted the event, welcomed a total of 314,264 fans. The world's most-watched annual sporting event was aired in more than 200 countries – an estimated global average audience in the region of 165 million and a projected global unique reach of 380 million viewers.

Hotels: a variety of accommodation in Cardiff, Newport, Swansea and Bristol was provided.

Volvo Ocean Race Cardiff Stopover 2018

Over 180,000 visitors enjoyed a two week long free festival. The global sailing event started in Alicante, Spain on a race around the world, where it visited 12 cities, touched six continents and for the first time in its history stopped in Cardiff.

Visitors could find out more about the challenging race in the team bases and cinema, plus enjoy a true Welsh flavour with locally-sourced food and drink, alongside live music sessions on the waterfront. The event also focused on sustainability and the Volvo Ocean Race, in partnership with key sponsors, held the prestigious Ocean Summit to raise awareness of the dangerously increasing problem of ocean plastic.

Venue: The award-winning 1,956 seat St David's Hall proved to be a versatile, additional venue alongside the University's Cathays Campus. It hosted the Welcome Reception, Awards Ceremony, conference plenary sessions, paper sessions, a poster exhibition and the Farewell Party with vintage live-themed band and disco. Performances from the Cardiff Arms Park Male Choir added a distinctive Welsh flavour to the gathering with musical



entertainment also provided by a harpist.

The majority of the conference sessions were held in three University buildings within easy walking distance of St David's Hall.



Iconic Cardiff

Come and explore the Principality Stadium, one of the most impressive icons of modern Wales.


Join the tour guides and visit the Press
Conference Suite where the worlds of rugby and journalism meet. Experience the build up before the match in the Dragon's Lair, Wales' team dressing room. Hear the roar of 74,500 fans as you walk down the players' tunnel towards the hallowed turf. Learn about the only fully retractable roof in the UK, how the entire playing surface can be removed to create one of the largest indoor arenas. Take in the view of the pitch from a VIP hospitality suite and finally lift the trophy to the skies like a sporting superstar in the President's Box, an area normally reserved for royalty.

From the Principality Stadium, take a short walk to Cardiff Castle where you can explore Cardiff's heritage. Spanning nearly 2,000 years of history and originally the site of a Roman fortress, the grounds are today dominated by the dramatic Norman Keep. The guided tour will unveil the lavish Gothic-Revival interiors of the Castle Apartments created for the Third Marquess of Bute by eccentric architect William Burges in the 19th century.

After a visit to Cardiff Castle, take the leisurely journey from Bute Park in the city centre to Cardiff Bay on the Princess Katharine, a fully equipped, covered vessel with a capacity for 90 passengers and operated by qualified skippers.

Once docked in Mermaid Quay, make the short walk towards Cardiff Bay Barrage and take a break, enjoy a coffee, a bite to eat, or afternoon tea at the Norwegian Church, an iconic building at the water's edge and former place of worship for Norwegian sailors and the church where Roald Dahl was christened.

Conclude your day with a visit to the Wales Millennium Centre where you can enjoy West End hit musicals, opera, ballet, contemporary dance, hip hop and stand up comedy shows.





Heritage


Begin your day with a visit and tour of the beautiful Llandaff Cathedral which is set apart from the bustle of the city of Cardiff, nestling in a hollow in a secluded site beside the River Taff. The Cathedral lies in the ancient 'City of Llandaff' much of which is now a conservation area.

From Llandaff Cathedral travel a short distance to your next destination St Fagans

National Museum of History. Within one hundred acres of attractive countryside, a magical place has been created. Authentic dwellings from different periods in Wales' history sit alongside fascinating exhibitions showing Wales' history and culture. Situated 4 miles west of Cardiff, visitors can explore the buildings ranging from the 2,000 year-old Celtic village to an impressive Elizabethan

mansion house. Seize the opportunity to see a potter, weaver, wood-turner, baker, tanner and many more craftspeople at work.

To complete the day, visit the Royal Mint Experience which is just 30 minutes from Cardiff. Here you can gain unprecedented access to The Royal Mint to discover the people and events behind the coins in your pocket.


